Join in the Jungle Tour from July 6th - 14th 2013

Why? To defend the rights of exiles in Europe

Where? From Lens in Northern France to the city of Canterbury

AIM: As in previous years, the Jungle Tour is pursuing its aim of shining a spotlight on the situation of exiles. This year, the route will take us to the UK, to highlight the work of volunteer groups who support and give humanitarian aid to those exiles who have managed to reach the country. This summer, like every summer since 2010, we will try to bring about meetings with the public, gather information, and discuss the impact of national and international laws, the way the authorities handle exiles, the changes in European rules and so on. All in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere.

We are combating stereotypes about exiles and expressing our conviction that asylum is a right and welcoming asylum-seekers a duty. We will focus on the stalemate that has existed since the closure of the Sangatte camp in 2002 for exiles trying to cross the Channel. Little has changed despite the actions undertaken by volunteer groups, sometimes supported by elected officials.

Every summer since 2010 we have challenged the authorities concerned, in Lille, Arras and Brussels on the non-application of the rights of exiles seeking protection.

TAKE ACTION. JOIN IN: on foot, by bike, by train, by car!

Route: On Saturday 6th July he Jungle Tour will leave from the site of the new LOUVRE in Lens, as a symbol of forward-looking cultural exchange and "reappropriation".

The tour will then move to nearby Grenay, followed, the next day, Sunday 7th by Norrent-Fontes, then Bailleul, on Monday 8th, Grande Synthe on Tuesday 9th and Wednesday 10th July, Calais on Thursday 11th and finally Canterbury from Friday 12th to Sunday 14th July (Dover to Canterbury leg on Friday 12th, Canterbury to Dover on Sunday 14th)
